- Total Foundation assets were \$3.7 billion as of Dec. 31, 2025. Included in total assets are endowed assets, non-endowed assets, and assets managed by WVUF for WVU-affiliated agencies.
- 3,687 endowed funds
- Average size of endowed fund (market value): \$252,607
- 2,369 endowed and non-endowed scholarships
- 168 endowed faculty chairs, professorships, and deanships
- The net investment return for the Long Term Investment Pool for fiscal year 2025 was 5.4%.

WVU AT A GLANCE

- Public, land-grant institution
- Research Classification - R1: Doctoral Universities - Highest research activity as described by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education

UNIVERSITY PROFILE

- 26,046 – WVU System enrollment
- Students come from over 90 countries, 50 U.S. states (plus D.C.), and all 55 West Virginia counties.
- WVU recipients of prestigious scholarships include 25 Rhodes Scholars, 27 Truman Scholars, and 53 Goldwater Scholars.
- 66% of full-time instructional/tenure-track faculty hold the highest academic degree in their field.



ESTIMATED AVERAGE COST

For full-time students 2025-2026
(Morgantown campus)

- In-state tuition/fees per semester: \$5,376
- Out-of-state tuition/fees per semester: \$15,216
- Average room and board per semester: \$6,700

Room and board are the same for in- and out-of-state residents.

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the WVU system awards over \$400 million in financial aid, including nearly \$200 million in grants and scholarships. Approximately 93% of freshmen receive some sort of scholarship aid. The approximate cost of an endowment for a full scholarship (in-state tuition, average room and board) is \$600,000.

STATE APPROPRIATION AS A PERCENT OF TOTAL BUDGET



The University's budget — which includes the academic component of the Health Sciences schools — is approximately \$1.29 billion. Given state appropriation reductions since 2013, current state appropriations account for only about 15% of the total WVU budget. This means that your support for WVU is now more critical than ever.



WVU HEALTH SYSTEM

- The WVU Health System is West Virginia's largest health system and the state's largest employer with more than 3,400 licensed beds, 4,600 providers, and 35,000 employees.
- As of Jan. 1, 2026, the WVU Health System comprises 25 hospitals — including J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital, an 880-bed academic medical center, and the 150-bed WVU Medicine Golisano Children's Hospital in Morgantown — and five institutes. Pending necessary approvals, Independence Health System's five Pennsylvania hospitals will join WVU Medicine in fall 2026.
- The WVU Cancer Institute is making strategic investments in cancer care and research to achieve the state's first National Cancer Institute designation.
